The winter season athletes get together for celebration of the 2009 winter season, and the awarding of the 2009 Aths Waverley brownlow, over dinner.



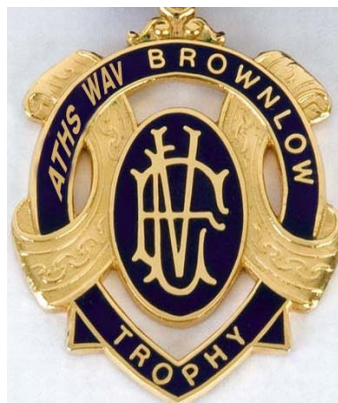

Athletics Waverley Survey Results - 2009

Several months ago, members of Athletics Waverley were encouraged to complete a survey about our club. The results are to assist with forward planning initiatives and direction of the Club. A total of 38 members responded to the survey. This article summarises the findings.

Members were asked to rate 9 areas from a choice of 5 categories ranging from very poor to excellent. Areas such as 'our training facilities', 'social events', 'coaches and training schedules', 'summer season' and 'winter season' were rated with clear agreement within okay, good and excellent. Other areas such as 'Athletics Victoria Program', 'sponsorship', 'membership numbers' and 'coordination of competition event participation' had much wider differences of opinion.

The most significant purpose of the survey was to determine the capital priorities of the club for the years ahead. A choice of 18 options was provided with provision for additional ideas and each person prioritised their top 5 choices. From the individual rankings a matrix was developed.

Highest priority items the Club should concentrate on in terms of capital improvement suggestions are:

Additional lighting around track for night training

Synthetic all weather training track additional to existing tracks (e.g. either circular track within the centre of the existing track or sprint area in centre of track)

Additional Coaches and extension of coaching programs

Additional external shelter around club rooms and also within arena

Water Saving initiatives (e.g. rain water tanks or upgrade of irrigation facility)

Note two items for equal fourth priority

With reference to fee structure, the majority feedback was fees were about right with a preference to increase, rather than decrease fees

Many people took the time to also contribute ideas with reference to open questions on sponsorship funding, improvements for Athletics Waverley and other ideas the Committee should consider. This input has been tabled at a recent Committee Meeting and again will be used for ongoing improvements with Athletics Waverley.

A good profile of members completed the survey covering off gender and the various age categories. Thank you to all those who took the time to complete the survey. The results are a very useful tool to assist with ongoing Management of Athletics Waverley.

ONE HOUR RUN — 23 AUGUST 2009



We had a pretty good field of both runners and supporters/ helpers with 11 starters on the track and nearly as many hecklers off the track.

The field was led away by Rick Whitehead closely followed by Andrew Moore and Jeremy Nagle. Jeremy dropped off after a lap and it was Rick and Moore together for the first 7 laps until Moore worked out that Rick was only doing the half hour event, and he quickly dropped back. Jeremy gradually hauled in Moore pulling James along behind him. From there Jeremy turned it on and put a big gap on Moore who was suffering from his fast start. Jeremy went on to win with an impressive distance of 15.70km. Jeremy had a pretty heavy schedule running a Sri Chomnoy half marathon a couple of weeks earlier and will be skiing a half marathon the next weekend and then fronting up for the Burnley Half a week later. Rick cleaned up in the half hour race with 8.05km, a lap ahead of his 7.65km last year. He's having a great season.

In the womens field, we had a good turnout with 4 girls including potential new member Geraldine Low who had just enquired about the club a week earlier. Nickie Scriven was a late starter giving a 2 minute 20 headstart to the field, but running strongly she managed to catch the other girls and recorded the impressive distance of 12.72km just beating Sally's record of 12.58km last year.

Well done to all runners and a big thank you to all the helpers - Alan, Yvonne, Faye, Sally, Chris, Graeme, Sandra. The esky and bbq afterwards was a great way to finish off the morning's work.

BURNLEY HALF MARATHON—6 SEPTEMBER 2009

For a while the course record of 63:30 looked in danger, but in the end he won in the impressive time of 64:20. First in for Waverley was the House with a solid 70:59. He went out hard with the lead bunch then paid the price as he dropped back through the field, but somehow pulled out an awesome last 3K to reel in 4 quality runners and finish 13th. Jeremy Nagle somehow managed to run 5K and 10K PB's on his way through to a half marathon PB of 79:15. Rohan just missed the 80 minute mark.

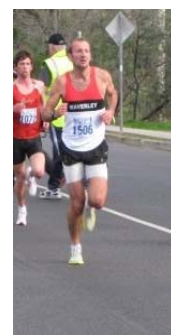

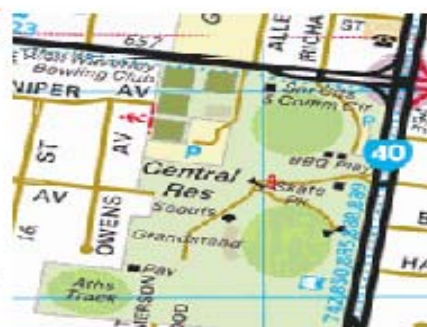
